Chemical Weapons in History

The use of “Chemical Warfare Agents” or poisons is probably as old as warfare itself. This forum will trace the development and use of chemical weapons from WWI to those more recently used. Emphasis will be on what we can do about its possible use by terrorists.

Dr. Nelson Rebert obtained his BS from the University of Maryland and his PhD in Organic Chemistry from the University of Utah. During his post-doctoral fellowship, he was recruited into the US Army where he stayed for 20 years. Among his many experiences are teaching a course on the history and detection of biological warfare (BW) and working on Anthrax Letters analysis. He was also stationed in Japan working as a liaison with Japanese Self-Defense Force for three years. He recently moved to Hawaii and is currently serving as Secretary of ACS Hawaii Section.
