Global Climate Change Education (GGCE): Research Experiences, Teaching & Learning.

Solicitation: NNL09ZB1005C

This new program element solicits proposals to:

- Improve teacher competency for Global Climate Change Education;
- Use NASA Earth System data and models to strengthen teaching and learning about Global Climate Change;
- Provide Global Climate Change Science Research Experiences for undergraduate or community college students and pre- or in-service teachers, including those in non-traditional teacher licensure programs.

The following categories of U.S. organizations are eligible to propose: higher education institutions, state, local, or federally-recognized tribal government agencies, public school districts, nonprofit institutions (with proof of nonprofit 501(c)(3) status), Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSI), and Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCU), as well as other minority-serving educational institutions (See Section 1.4.1 of the *Guidebook for Proposers*). Eligible science museums and planetariums are encouraged to propose in partnership with academic institutions towards achievement of the objectives stated in this CAN.

Notices of Intent to propose are due July 2, 2009, and full proposals are due August 3, 2009.

A pre-proposal teleconference with an opportunity for questions will be held June 18, 2009, 1:00 pm EDT to 3:00 pm EDT.
