Hi Jim,

Here is the information about the Salt Lake City region as a model for citizen-participation urban growth management. I've attached a file whose first two-and-one-half pages present the story of what happened there. You can see an expanded version of the same material at www.ecotippingpoints.org/ETP-Stories/indepth/usautah.html. Appendices A-C at the bottom of that webpage are particularly helpful – especially appendix C, which shows how different urban growth scenarios can be compared.

In addition to the attached file, I *highly recommend* looking at “Envision Utah: Producing a Future for the Greater Wasatch Area,” which is at www.ecotippingpoints.org/resources/ETP_Envision-Utah.pdf. It provides a detailed account of what happened during the first three years (1977-1979), showing clearly how it could be done here. The last part of the attached file has a proposal from Calthorpe Associates indicating concretely how we could get started doing the same thing.

Please let me know if you know anyone who would be interested in showing this idea to some of the movers and shakers on this island to form a coalition to get something started here. Also, please let me know if any graduate students in education would be interested in doing an internship with me to develop concrete applications of EcoTipping Points for education at any level.
